What's New in the?

Fluorescent immunoassay of prostate-specific

antigen in immunoglobulin G. Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) is the most frequently used tumor marker for prostate cancer. The reference range for PSA is 0.1-3.4 ng/mL. A fluorescent immunoassay has been developed for the detection of serum PSA. The double antibody sandwich technique was used to capture and detect the PSA, which was labeled with fluorescein by a two-step reaction system. This immunoassay, with a detection limit of 0.05 ng/mL, is simple and less expensive than the standard method. Serum PSA levels obtained by this fluorescence immunoassay showed good correlation with the standard assay ($R^2 = 0.928$). The sensitivity of the assay was comparable to that of a polystyrene tube radioimmunoassay ($R^2 = 0.907$), and the fluorescent immunoassay was 100 times more sensitive than the radioimmunoassay. The intra- and inter-assay coefficients of variation of the fluorescent immunoassay were less than

4.0%.Q: What's a good way to have multiple instances of a class? I have an application that has a main class. On initial launch, the main class creates several helper classes that are used to further classify things in the application, like classes for different types of clients. The problem is the main class is loaded, and creates the helper classes, and then the helper classes are never used again. I'd like them to be instantiated at any given point in the application, since there's obviously one instance of a client per one instance of the main class. Is there a good way of doing this in .NET? Or, is there a good way to use helper classes elsewhere in the application?
